

## BIBLE

Read Matthew 19:14 aloud to your child. Read the verse slowly and have your child repeat it back to you.

Listen to “Let the Little Children Come” by Steve Green and sing along.

## LETTERS

A is for apple.

Follow the steps on page 10 for the letter A.

Read *The Apple Pie Tree* by Zoe Hall. Borrow this book from the library or listen to someone read it on YouTube. \*Remember to reserve the books for the next 3 weeks at the library.

## ART

Slice an apple in half. Put red, green, and yellow paint on a paper plate. Paint a brown tree trunk on a white piece of paper and let it dry. Your child can add apples to the apple tree by dipping the cut apples flat side down into paint and stamping them around the top of the tree. (Scan the QR code on page 68 for a sample.)

## NUMBERS

Cut to the core of an apple. Help your child remove the seeds from the apple. Count the seeds together.

## HABIT

Focus on the habit of obedience this week.

Read “Frog and Toad Are Friends - Spring” on page 8.

## SENSORY

Gather a large cotton ball and three plastic cups. Use the large cotton ball to represent the sheep. Put the sheep under a cup and mix the cups. Where is the sheep? Your child can play hide and seek with the sheep and guess where it is hiding.

## NATURE

Go to the grocery store or farmer's market and notice the different varieties of apples. Ask your child to choose two or three apples of different varieties to bring home. Taste them and choose a favorite.
