Read chapter 2 in *Herodotus and the Road to History*. Follow with oral or written narration.

Map-Drawing: Turkey – Watercolor the physical map of Turkey. See student sample on page 128 for inspiration. Display the completed map!

Compare the maps of the Empires of Persia and Greece on page 17 in *The Student Bible Atlas* to a modern world map or globe.
