GEOGRAPHY



Visit Exmoor National Park in England using the QR code. Find the park on page 123.

Read Lesson 14 in *Elementary Geography*. Read Lesson 9 in Charlotte Mason's *Geographical Reader Book 2*. Follow with narration.

Map-Drawing: Scotland – Draw the outline of Scotland with a pencil on watercolor paper. Trace with a thin black Sharpie. See student sample on page 127 for inspiration.

ENRICHMENT

Artist Study: Read about George Stubbs on page 91. Study *Whistlejacket* on page 92. Discuss the questions on page 14.

LITERATURE

COPYWORK

Primary: You are not one of us. [The Wind in the Willows]

Elementary: It's not the sort of night for bed, anyhow. [The Wind in the Willows]

NATURE STUDY

Nature Lore: Elementary: Read Lesson 10 in *Plant Life in Field and Garden*. Follow with narration.

Middle: Read half of "Soil" in *Madam How and Lady Why*. Follow with narration.

Nature Journal: Brush-draw a leaf. Identify and label the Latin and common name of the leaf. Older students can add a poem. See pages 151-152 and 159-160 in Edith Holden's book for inspiration.

Nature Walk: Go foraging or hunting for plants, mushrooms, herbs, and fruits in the forest. **Don't eat anything before checking with an adult to make sure it is safe.
